

Decodable Readers



In our ongoing efforts to build our library of decodable texts, Decodable Readers Australia books will be great to supplement and provide students with another option for reading at home.

Decodable readers are a crucial tool in helping children build their reading skills by gradually introducing them to the relationships between letters and sounds. These readers contain words that can be sounded out using the phonics skills your child is learning. This approach helps young readers gain confidence as they decode words and sentences, paving the way for improved fluency and comprehension.

This week your child may have received their username and password and QR code granting them access to Decodable Readers Australia Online platform where they can access 100's of fiction and non-fiction readers, videos and lessons. Classroom teachers have personalised your child's online platform by selecting levels that would best suit your child.

This platform is designed for beginning readers and supports students to practise their decoding skills instead of relying on pictures or guessing.

Go to: <u>https://draonline.com.au/</u> and sign in using their username and password or simply open the camera function on your device and scan the QR code to take them to their online platform.

We believe that this resource is a valuable addition to our growing decodable text library and be another support for your child in their reading journey.

Teachers and support staff will continue to use a range of decodable readers at school. We have an extensive selection of Little Learners Love Literacy books for our small group, whole class, take home readers and reading intervention program. These are a wonderful resource that both the students and teachers enjoy!

DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY
