CUP DAY HOLIDAY

Our school will remain open the day before Cup Day again this year. Many of our families still choose to take a long weekend at this time so we would like to get some idea of those children who will or won't be attending school on Monday 6th November. BIKE EDUCATION

Our prep to grade 2 children will be taking part a bike education course as part of our HPE program on Friday 13, 20 and 27 October. The course will be taken by a qualified instructor and will take place on the school grounds. Children will develop their safe riding skills.

We would like parents to drop their children's bike and helmet (named) at the school next week. The bikes will be stored below the deck by the oval. A bike safety check will be carried out in preparation for the program. If children need to use their bikes over the weekends parents can collect and drop them off so they are here for the Friday sessions. Loan bikes are available.

NEW BUILDING UPDATE

A new electricity main has been installed to allow the school's power to be reconnected and generators to be removed.

Wet weather has delayed the completion of our new portable installation. We hope to be able to move into the building next week.

The tendering process for our new school building is currently under way with builders visiting our site to assess the project.

HOT WEATHER DAYS – 35 DEGREES AND OVER

On days forecast to be 35 degrees and over we run a different timetable. The lunch break is shortened to half an hour and the children start their afternoon classes earlier. The school day finishes at 3:00pm and parents are able to collect their children from 3:00pm. Children will still be supervised in class until the normal dismissal time of 3:20pm. This will keep the children out of the sun for an extended period of time in extreme conditions. We will use the official Bureau of Meteorology weather forecast. Please contact the school if you are unsure of our arrangements on these days.

2024 PREP TRANSITION

Our 2024 transition program begins next week with Storytime sessions in the Prep rooms. Formal classroom transition sessions will take place on Friday mornings during November from 9:00am until 10:15am. At this stage we have 36 preps enrolled for next year.

SCHOOL LUNCH CHEAT SHEET

PACK FOOD YOUR CHILD WILL EAT

- Food does little to give your child fuel to learn and perform if it goes uneaten.
- Balance nutritious choices with ensuring that your child has food s/he is willing to eat.

MONOTONY IS FINE -IF IT'S WORKING

- You don't need to have a vast array of lunch ideas for your child.
- Varying the vegetable, fruit, protein source a couple times a week (or month) are more than adequate to provide ample variety.

BE COST-CONSCIOUS

- Food waste is a consideration. Don't over pack!
- Convenience foods save time, but also have a higher price tag. Aim to include foods that are not prepackaged as often as possible.

KEEP IT SIMPLE

- Lunch time offers many distractions.
 Make it easy for your child to see what is available, open packaging and eat.
- You don't need to create a photoworthy lunch.

INCLUDE LEAN PROTEIN

- Don't forget about plant protein including tofu, edamame, roasted chickpeas or even dips like hummus.
- Pay attention to food safety with protein foods as they are the most likely to cause illness.

PRESENTATION MATTERS

- Make it appealing, colorful
- · Use a bento box or divided container
- Clear containers
- Cookie cutters
- Bite sizes foods
- Cut fruit/vegetables
